

# Troop 1018 Camping Checklist

## Long term Summer Camp

*Note: Typically it's possible to drive close to the campsite for unloading, however, Scouts are expected to carry their gear from the car to the campsite. Don't take more than you need and try to put it all in your duffel bag or backpack.*

### Duffel Bag or Backpack

#### Sleeping Gear

- Sleeping Bag (or lightweight covers)
- Pad or Inflatable Mattress
- Pillow or Inflatable Pillow

#### Things to Wear

- Poncho or other Rain Gear
- Footwear
  - Sneakers
  - Comfortable hiking boots
  - River Shoes (or old sneakers)
  - Socks (for hiking, include sock liners)
- Complete Class A Uniform including:
  - Shirt with proper patches
  - Pants
  - Socks
  - Hat
  - Neckerchief (red with white trim)
  - Neckerchief slide
  - Belt w/buckle
- Class B T-shirts
- Pants and shirts
- Jacket or sweater
- Undershirts & underpants
- Swim trunks
- Pajamas

#### Toilet Kit containing:

- Soap
- Deodorant
- Shampoo
- Toothbrush and toothpaste
- Toilet Paper
- Comb or brush
- Towels and washcloth
- Mirror

Cooking gear (note: optional when camp has a chow hall)

- Plate
- Cup
- Bowl
- Knife, fork, spoon
- Rinse bag
- Spices

**Other Miscellaneous Gear**

- Scout knife & pouch
- Handkerchief or bandana
- Insect repellent
- Sun screen
- Lip balm (w/UV protection)
- Compass
- Sunglasses (w/UV protection)
- Regular glasses (if you need them)
- Emergency whistle
- Boy Scout Handbook
- Rope (nylon cord)
- Flashlight
- Extra batteries for flashlight
- Pencil, pen, notebook
- Personal first aid kit
- Canteen or water bottle

**Optional, but useful**

- Binoculars
- Camera
- Extra film
- Non electronic games (e.g. playing cards, chess)
- Watch
- Reading material
- Personal chair
- Work gloves
- Musical instrument (e.g. guitar or harmonica)

Do NOT bring: CD players, radios, electronic games
